



Radiography Program Application Process

All students admitted to the Radiography program must successfully pass a criminal background check and a drug screen.

1. Provide copy of unofficial high school transcript or GED. Transcript and diploma must be attached to your application. Also any college you have attended, please provide unofficial transcripts.
2. Complete Radiography Application & attach applicable transcripts (see step 1) and attach items from step 3 - 5.
3. Current TB skin test.
4. Provide three (3) letters of recommendation (can use form provided on web-site or have persons type or hand-write recommendations) - We do **not** accept recommendations from family members. Attach all to Radiography Application.
5. On a separate sheet of paper, please answer the following questions:
 - a. Give your reasons for choosing Radiography as a career.
 - b. The Radiography courses are very time intensive. What plans have you made to prepare to meet this schedule?
 - c. What are your plans and aspirations for the future?
6. The applicant will be required to take the HOBET[®] (Health Occupations Basic Entrance Test) Exam.
 - a. To register for this exam, the applicant must go to this website: <http://ati.allyedhealth.com/home.aspx> and first create an account. Once the account is created then you will click on the online store. On the left side of the screen click on register for HOBET[®]. Once you click on this link you will follow the directions on the screen to register and pay for the exam. You will come to NPCC Testing Center to actually take the exam.
 - b. Study resources can be found at this website: http://www.ati.allyedhealth.com/ati_store/.
 - c. The fee for test-taking is \$30.00 and must be paid when you register for the exam online.
7. Upon completion of the application process, the division secretary will contact you to schedule your eight hours of observation. Observations will be arranged in March and April.
8. All paperwork is to be completed and returned to Radiography Office by March 15th.

ADMISSION PROCEDURES:

Admission to the Radiography Program is selective with a new class starting in the fall of each year. Applications for the Radiography Program are accepted during the spring semester with a deadline of the second Monday in March. Applications may be accessed through this web site (<http://www.npcc.edu>) or by calling the Health Sciences secretary at 501-760-4269. Completed application along with official transcripts and a copy of a current TB skin test must be submitted to the Health Sciences Secretary. It is your responsibility to assure that all paperwork is complete when submitted including taking the HOBET[®] exam. Once your admission file is complete, you will be contacted by the Health Sciences secretary to schedule an observation in the radiology department at two area hospitals. You will be required to complete a total of eight hours observation at two different hospitals. Observations will be arranged in February through April.

The last step of the admissions process will be an interview with the program faculty. **Acceptance will be based on HOBET[®] scores, grade point average in prerequisite courses and recommendation of the Admissions Committee.**
