REFUNDS

No refunds of student tuition/fees will be made unless a student OFFICIALLY withdraws from classes. Stopping class attendance or failure to attend classes does not constitute an official drop/withdrawal. **ALL refunds are calculated from the start date of the semester, not the start date of the class, and are based on week days excluding holidays – not class days.**

The first week 100% of tuition and all fees, excluding registration fee will be refunded.

The second week 50% of tuition, technology and infrastructure fees will be refunded.

No refunds will be made after 10th day of the semester.

COURSE METHODS

Traditional Lecture Courses

TRAD

Traditional formalized instruction conducted on campus in a face-to-face classroom setting.

Compressed Interactive Video Courses

CIV

On campus class at specific times with the instruction completed via two-way interactive video and audio conferencing originating from another site.

Web-enhanced Courses

WEB

Campus based course that will use the Internet and/or Angel as instructional tools to enhance the learning experience. Computer literacy is required.

Online Courses

ONLINE

A course that may require a maximum of five on-campus class meetings, with the majority of the instruction occurring through the internet and/or Angel. These courses may require students to take at least two proctored assessments at a pre-approved testing site. Computer literacy is required

Blended Courses

BLENDED

A course where traditional instruction is hybrid with online instruction technologies (email, web sites, Angel). Computer literacy is required

Laboratory Courses

LAB

Classes that are predominately clinical or the educational activity consists of experiments, to perfect skills, or to practice procedures under the direction of an instructor.

Computer Assisted Courses

CAC

A course where instruction is computer based, with the instructor as a facilitator. Students are required to attend classes in a face-to-face classroom setting. Computer literacy is preferred.
