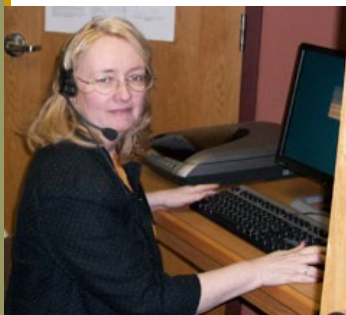
TUTORING CENTER

DISABILITIES SERVICES

Student Support Services provides academic accommodations, as well as other services, to all qualified students with disabilities. Audrey Smelser-Kroha, SSS Counselor/Disability Specialist, will be hosting a workshop entitled “Dragon Naturally Speaking is for Everyone.” The workshop demonstrates a voice dictation system that allows you to speak faster than you can type. Students who prefer speaking to typing, can’t type fast, have a disability, or think that it is just plain fun to use software will learn from this workshop how to dictate using the Dragon Naturally Speaking software. With the overhead projector and the latest version, more students can use the software with very little training.
