During the Workshop, demonstration of various adaptive technology such as Dragon Naturally Speaking, Premier Software, Scan and Read, Magic Eyes, and Wynn Software will be presented. The software is available to all students who need tools to assist them with writing and reading. ALL students can benefit by using adaptive technology, whether they have a disability or not. All students who attend the workshop will be given access to downloading “Free” software from the Premier Software Company.
